Thank you for anything that you do. I am sure, that as you have in the past, you will now give meaning to the phrase that "Kiwanis is where a need is served."

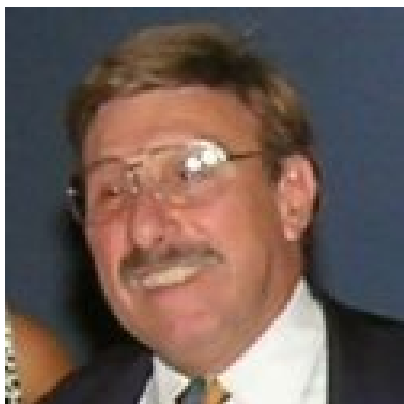
## AROUND THE DIVISION
